Did you know that two old coal plants in Pilsen and Little Village are Chicago's largest stationary sources of particulate and global warming pollution in the city, and that their emissions are responsible for 41 premature deaths and 2800 asthma attacks every year? Or that a grassroots movement, designed to hold elected officials accountable for making Chicago a safer and healthier place to live, is bubbling up in a number of Chicago's Wards?
